ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Students interested in applying to St. Mary's are encouraged to attend our Fall Open House. St. Mary's offers a shadow program, allowing prospective students the opportunity to spend a day visiting our school. STUDENTS APPLYING FOR ADMISSION TO GRADE 7

There is limited enrollment due to the size of the junior high school. Students should apply as early as possible during their sixth-grade year. Interested applicants will be placed on a waiting list once all seats are filled. To be considered for acceptance:

- † Complete the **Application for Admission** and return it to the Admissions Office along with a \$25 non-refundable application fee.
- † Complete the **Transcript Release Form** and submit it to the school where you are currently enrolled. The school will be responsible for forwarding your transcript to St. Mary's. Students are accepted on a rolling admission basis and will be notified of acceptance when the application and transcript are received and reviewed.

STUDENTS APPLYING FOR ADMISSION TO GRADE 9

- † Register to take the **High School Placement Test**. This exam is offered at St. Mary's. (See inserts for specific times and dates.) Academic scholarships are based primarily upon the results of this exam with consideration given to seventh and eighth grade transcripts, other standardized test scores, and recommendations from your current school. The school code for St. Mary's is "28." Listing "28" on your answer sheet the day of the exam ensures that your test scores will be sent to us. This completes the first step for admission and consideration for an academic scholarship.
- † Complete the **Application for Admission** and return it, along with a \$25 non-refundable application fee, to the Admissions Office no later than January 1.
- † Complete the **Transcript Release Form** and submit it to the school where you are currently enrolled. Please allow at least two weeks for forwarding. It should be received at St. Mary's no later than January 1.
- † Acceptance letters and scholarship notification will be mailed on February 1.

STUDENTS APPLYING FOR ADMISSION TO GRADES 8, 10, 11, 12

Students, who wish to transfer to St. Mary's during the school year, or who are seeking admission for the following academic year, must complete and submit an Application for Admission (include a \$25 non-refundable application fee) and a **Transcript Release Form**.
