


Natali Severino Payano '15 Business major





FINANCIAL AID

Marian Court College is committed to making a quality higher education possible for all students, regardless of financial need. More than 93 percent of Marian Court students receive some form of financial aid, including federal and state grants, merit scholarships and Marian Court College grants. Direct loans and federal work study are available to those who qualify.

To determine financial aid eligibility, students must fill out a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (www.fafsa.ed.gov) and be accepted by the college. Final financial aid awards are based on FAFSA results, enrollment status and filing deadlines. May 1 is the priority deadline for financial aid applicants.
